FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly Most Holy Name Catholic Church, Garfield, NJ The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph December 31, 2023

"The shepherds went in haste to Bethlehem and found Mary and Joseph and the baby lying in a manger. When they saw this, they made known the message that had been told them about this child... And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart."

As the year draws to a close, it is customary to review the events of the prior twelve months. Disasters like war, wild fires and political indictments jump from the headlines. The crowning of a king, the gathering of millions for World Youth Day, mark special positive celebrations.

May we return to this past week when we celebrated the Incarnation, the birth of Jesus as our Savior and Redeemer as we begin a new year.

Like Mary, we reflect prayerfully on the many sacred events of 2023, and take the gift of Jesus Christ into 2024. For many Christmas is over, but for believers the presence of God with us, Emmanuel, is so important.

As we greet others for the new year, may we be like the shepherds, and make known the message we have heard and experience, the love of the Holy Family in our own hearts and homes.

First Reading: Genesis 15:1-6, 21:1-3

Abram shows us the Lord keeps His promises, for his offspring were indeed many, like the stars in heaven. We, too, must trust in the Lord, so like Abram, our families might prosper.

Second Reading: Hebrews 11:8, 11-12, 17-19

By faith Abraham and Sarah were blessed with Isaac, and through him, many descendants because they trusted in God's promise and believed in what they could not see. We see that faith, trust and prayer bring forth God's miracles in our lives.

Gospel: Luke 2:22-40

Jesus was brought to Jerusalem to be consecrated according to the law of Moses. A man named Simeon had learned he would not die until he had

seen God's anointed. Upon seeing Jesus, he immediately declared he had witnessed "the glory of your people of Israel." The prophetess Anna also gave thanks and spoke of Jesus to all who would listen. Both recognized the power of Jesus, although he was still an infant.



Those in the cry room or the restrooms.




